Resolution to Transfer an Unknown Distribution of Docket 75 Funds Held in Account JA9210103 by the Bureau of Indian Affairs – Office of Special Trustee to The Northern Trust Company


- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council, through GTC Resolution #1-8-77-C, delegated administrative authority to the Oneida Trust Committee to implement the Oneida Trust Plan, Docket 75, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Trust Committee is the official governing and final authoritative body to carry out all policy and procedures in the operation of the Oneida Enrollment and Trust Departments, and
- WHEREAS,** Judgment Award Account Number JA9210103 is a result of the judgment award in Docket 75, an Indian Claims Commission ruling in which the Emigrant New York Indians recovered the value of a claim area of 4,009,000 acres of land acquired by their ancestors from the Menominee Indians under a treaty between the Menominee and the Stockbridge Nation, the First Christian Party of the Oneida Nation, the Tuscarora Nation, the St. Regis Nation and the Munsee Nation on September 23, 1822, and
- WHEREAS,** pursuant to the Judgment Award of the Indian Claims Commission decision on October 8, 1964, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin were to be awarded \$1,452,824, less all proper offsets, and
- WHEREAS,** Public Law 90-93, provides for the disposition of funds appropriated to pay a judgment in favor of the Emigrant New York Indians in Indian Claims Commission Docket Numbered 75, and
- WHEREAS,** Section 5 of Public Law 90-93 states "The funds apportioned to the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and the Stockbridge-Munsee Indian Community of Wisconsin shall be placed to their credit and may be used, advanced, expended, deposited, invested, or reinvested for any purposes that are authorized by the tribal governing bodies thereof and approved by the Secretary of the Interior", and
- WHEREAS,** Account JA9210103 is an unknown source of distribution of Docket 75 whereby the funds were deposited with the BIA-OST for the benefit of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** in 1990, the Oneida General Tribal Council passed resolution 1-8-90 which included the direction to move Docket 75 funds from the BIA-OST to a suitable custodian, and
- WHEREAS,** it is the goal of the Oneida Trust Committee to consolidate the assets of Docket 75 into one account to be managed according to the Investment Policy Statement, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Trust Committee motioned on December 27, 2011 to consolidate all of Docket 75 funds with

the Oneida Trust Committee's custodian, The Northern Trust Company.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee direct the Bureau of Indian Affairs--Office of Special Trustee to transfer the balance of Account JA9210103, in the approximate amount of \$15,700, to The Northern Trust Company to the previously established Judgment Award Account at The Northern Trust Company.
