UGWA DEMOLUM YATEHE Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States, was made possible.

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain, and promote selfsufficiency and self reliance by providing food for those who cannot afford it, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Food Distribution Program would like to improve the quality of distribution to those who cannot find the transportation to pick up food items, and
- WHEREAS, that Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family will be strengthened by promoting the overall health and wellness of all Oneida Community members, especially for those who cannot afford food.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians

of Wisconsin-Oneida Food Distribution Program authorizes and submits this grant application to the State of Wisconsin, Department of Health and Social Services-Community based Hunger Prevention Project for the purpose of securing a refrigerated van for the purpose of safe and timely distribution of food items.
