RESOLUTION 2-19-79-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. is eligible to apply for contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to plan, conduct and administer all or parts of Bureau authorized programs under authority of Public Law 93-638; and,

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee, the tribal governing body, has determined that it wishes to exercise the contracting option;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The scope of the contract is to plan, conduct and administer the tribal home vegetable garden project.
2. The Tribal Chairman is authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any amendments thereto.
3. The authorities granted herein shall be effective until such time as the Oneida Business Committee takes further action by resolution.
4. The Oneida Business Committee shall review the contract and any amendments thereto before execution.
5. The proposed date for start of the contract is April 1, 1979, and shall be effective through September 30, 1979.

CERTIFICATION

Program and Policies

SEEDS

1. Publish simplified survey in Kali Wisaks - a tear-out that can be returned to Iroquois Farms (see attached)
2. Consolidate survey results
3. Make arrangements with reputable local seed company to purchase seeds in bulk. (I suggest Jung's of Randolph, Wisconsin.)
4. Notify prospective participants in Kali Wisaks of seed availability at Iroquois Farms at reduced cost. (1/2 or 1/3 reduction of retail counter cost)

POTATOES AND ONION SETS

1. Potato seed and onion sets - purchase limited quantity and distribute on a first-come-first-serve basis at reduced cost. This policy applies because this is a first-year trial basis for more perishable items.

PLANTS

1. Two types of cabbage (early and late) and one type of tomato distributed on a first-come-first-serve basis at a reduced cost
NOTE: For subsequent years, cold frames and/or a small greenhouse can be constructed just for generating these kinds of plants in quantity.

PLANT AND/OR SEED EXCHANGE

Families who have an excess of strawberry, raspberry, rhubarb or other plants or an excess of white corn, red beans or other seeds may want to exchange with other families for those plants/seeds they desire and do not have.

GARDEN SITE PREPARATION

1. Plowing - set fee per plot
2. Disking - set fee per plot.

There will be no charge to the elderly for these services

ACCOUNTING

All aspects of the project will be carefully recorded and reported at the end of the growing season, including best estimates of production.
