## RESOLUTION # 2-26-92-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the FBI conducted a series of criminal investigations related to the Oneida Tribe's Bingo Operations beginning in 1985 and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee desires to review the record in order to take steps to improve it's systems of accountability within the present Gaming Operation, and
- WHEREAS, the lack of identifying actual weaknesses from this report has hindered the Tribe in making the necessary changes to freely implement controls and to prevent such recurrences
- WHEREAS, the Internal Auditor will be authorized to receive the documents and will immediately notify the Business Committee Chairman or Vice Chairman of receipt of the documents and will hold these documents in sealed confidence until such time that an Executive Session with the Business Committee is arranged.
- WHEREAS, the Business Committee will schedule an Executive Session within 24 hours upon notification that the documents have been received.
- WHEREAS, these documents shall be kept in strictest confidence by the Business Committee and the Internal Auditor shall store these documents in a Safety Deposit box in a bank, until a determination is made for the use of it's contents or disposal.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee requests that the U. S. Attorney General, William P. Barr immediately provide results from this 1985-1989 investigation to the Oneida Business Committee in a Confidential manner, VIA certified mail to the Oneida Tribal Internal Auditor, Arvin Prebelski, P. O. Box 365, Oneida, Wisconsin 54155.
