Resolution 2-28-86

Whereas: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is committed to develop a stable, diversified local economy and economic activities which provide jobs, promote economic well being and reduce dependency on welfare services, and

Whereas, the opportunity exists to develop four convenience items, gasoline, diesel and cigarette outlets at various Reservation locations as described in the ANA objective work plan, and

Whereas: the Administration for Native Americans through the Department of Health and Human Services has multi-year grant funds available for the detailed feasibility analysis and implementation work required to make these projects a reality,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin stands committed to follow the recommendations of the feasibility work described herein, and hereby requests funding from ANA to perform those activities.
