

R E S O L U T I O N 3-1-76-A

WHEREAS; The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. fosters the concept and practice of securing and continuing programs which positively impact on the education of Indian children, and

WHEREAS; The Congress of the United States overrode the Presidential veto of the Health, Education and Welfare Bill: a Bill that contains sorely needed funding increases in areas of Indian Education, and

WHEREAS; These increases, especially those relevant to Title IV of the Indian Education Act, are now in jeopardy of being reduced to the same amount that was inadequate in the last two fiscal years, and

WHEREAS; The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc., deems the increased funding a necessary contribution toward attainment of requisite progressive educational programs, and applauds Congress' wisdom in its recent action.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. stands in support of Congress' override, and disbursement of the total earmarked funds.
