




Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

## RESOLUTION # 3-1-95-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian

government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the oneida Tribe

of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the

Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS Resolution 9-7-94-A will no longer be in effect after March 7, 1995, and

WHEREAS the circumstances and intentions of Resolution 9-7-94-A still exist, and

WHEREAS, official permanent amendments to the Administrative Procedures Act require General Tribal

Council action for approval,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that Resolution 9-7-94-A and it encompassing provisions be hereby extended for an additional six (6) month period.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Legislative Operating Committee be directed to provide proposed amendments to the Administrative Procedures Act to the General Tribal Council at the Semi-Annual General Council Meeting of July 1995.
