
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Robert L. Peterson Property II

WHEREAS the parcel is described as follows: Parcel I The Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (NW¼ of SE¼), Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Twenty-five (25) North, Range Nineteen (19) East, in the Town of Pittsfield, Brown County, Wisconsin, excepting therefrom that part thereof described in Volume 333 Deeds, page 25, Brown County Records. Parcel II The Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW¼ of SE¼), Section Twenty-nine (29); and the West One-half of the Northeast Quarter (W½ of NE¼), Section Thirty-two (32); all in Township Twenty-five (25) North, Range Nineteen (19) East, in the Town of Pittsfield, Brown County, Wisconsin, excepting therefrom those parts thereof described in Volume 332 Deeds, page 181, Volume 352 Deeds, page 97, Volume 629 Records, page 392, Volume 851 Records, page 33, and Jacket 1043 Records Image 5 as Document Number 855788, Brown County Records.

- WHEREAS the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and
