WHEREAS,	the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the General Tribal Council, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Community health Center has a responsibility to initiate a progressive management system to improve health services, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Communcity Health Center has developed a proposal for Total Quality Management training through a tribal management grant funded through the Indian Health Service, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Community Health Center proposal for providing Total Quality Management training will have a positive impact on delivery of health and community services, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Community Health Center is hereby authorized to submit a proposal to the Indian Health Service for a tribal management grant to provide Total Quality Management.
