Approval to Transfer Funds from the Self-Governance Emergency Reserve Account To cover Program Shortfalls as a Result of the Economic Downturn

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government, a Treaty Tribe

recognized by the laws of the United States, and a Self-Governance Tribe with the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs and with the Department of Health and Human Services' Indian Health

Service; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida

Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, it is the mission of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin to protect and improve the resources, the

standards of living, and the environment in which the Oneida people live while maintaining, enforcing, and

exercising the sovereign rights of the Oneida sovereignty; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has established an Emergency Reserve Fund consisting of administrative

funds negotiated from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to be used for Self-Governance-eligible programs and

services in the event of an unforeseen emergency; and

WHEREAS, the recent economic downturn has resulted in an operating deficit of \$118,662.46 among Tribal Self-

Governance-funded programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has the authority under Title IV, P.L. 93-638 to transfer funds from

the Emergency Reserve to be used to maintain the operational integrity of Self-Governance programs and

services administered by the Oneida Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin approves the transfer of \$118,662.46 from the Self-Governance Emergency Reserve Account to be used to cover the FY 2010 operational deficit among Tribally-operated Self-Governance programs and services.
