- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain, and promote self-sufficiency and self reliance by providing housing for those Oneida Tribal members who cannot afford it, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Development Division/Housing Development with collaboration of Oneida Social Services, and with a partnership with the State of Wisconsin/Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA) Foundation, will support persons in-crisis, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family will be strengthened by promoting the values of our Oneida Identity by providing housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin-Oneida Development Division/Oneida Housing Development and with collaboration of Oneida Social Services, authorizes and submits this grant application to the WHEDA Foundation-1999 Housing Grant Program Competition for the purpose of supporting persons in-crisis.
