

Resolution # 3-13-96-B

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of the Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority of the Constitution of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has determined that the regulation of domestic animals and livestock is in the best interests of the Oneida Tribe, its membership, and the surrounding communities, and

WHEREAS, prior laws have been reviewed and revised to reflect the current legal issues surrounding domestic animals within the Oneida Reservation, and

WHEREAS, there has been the required Public Hearings regarding the attached law, and that at the Public Hearing and during legislative discussion held thereafter there have been raised concerns regarding vicious dogs and how these animals should best be controlled to limit injuries while allowing owners the greatest flexibility in ownership,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribal Regulation of Domestic Animals Ordinance is hereby adopted in accordance with the procedures set forth the Oneida Administrative Procedures Act, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this ordinance shall be effective 30 days from the date of adoption, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, copies of this resolution and the attached ordinance shall be forwarded to the Oneida Police Department, Oneida Conservation Department, Oneida Housing Authority, Oneida Land Office, and the Environmental Resources Board for reference and implementation measures.
