RESOLUTION # 3-13-96-E

PROCLAMATION: National Public Health Week April 1-7, 1996

WHEREAS,

the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS,

the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS.

the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS,

the Oneida nation has determined that he overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

WHEREAS,

the Oneida Nation is committed to the improvement of health and wellness of the people for the next seven generations, and

WHEREAS,

the Oneida Nation wishes to recognize that promoting the health and quality of life of all of the members of the Oneida nation is a major goal of our Nation; and

WHEREAS,

appreciating that public health programs and services as provided by the Oneida Community health Center benefit everyone, regardless or race, ethnicity, and socioeconomic status, and are essential for the establishment of a strong, successful nation wide health care system; and

WHEREAS,

acknowledging that public health activities protect everyone from infectious diseases, environmental and workplace hazards, chronic diseases, unintentional injuries and violence, and, realizing that educating people about the benefits of adopting healthful behaviors can empower them to attain good health and prevent needless suffering; and
