
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

BC RESOLUTION 03-14-12-A

Grant Application to United States Department of Labor Workforce Innovation Fund to Create
Workforce Development Program

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, as the Tribally Designated Housing Entity under the Native American Housing Assistance and Self Determination Act of 1996, is currently in the process of a series of housing development and construction projects over the next few years due to grant opportunities, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has found that there is an immediate need to train our membership to meet the growing need of various trades with on-the-job training in order to provide the opportunity to become gainfully employed.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a grant application to the Department of Labor for Workforce Innovation Fund grant for the development of an innovative approach to employment and training services that generate long-term improvements.
