- WHEREAS TH adian Self Determination Act granted Tribes the right to contract areau Programs, and,
- WHEREAS The One ida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and,
- WHEREAS THE Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their encours,
- NOW HEREF BEE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee request a contract the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide funding from unbanded allocations for the construction of a Community Facility.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That contract negotiations, amendments and/or modifications be initiated through the Economic Developer and the Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.
- BE IT FURTHE RESOLVED: That all allocations pertaining to this contract be made available May 1, 1982 via Letter of Credit and that the proposed term of the ract commence on May 1, 1982 and complete April 30, 1983.
