- WHEREAS TE Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States,
- WHEREAS THE Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their en avor.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee, request a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to providing special land or reality services from unbanded allocations.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That contract negotiations, amendments and/or modifications be initiated through the Land Coordinator and the Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.
- BE IT FURTH RESOLVED: That the proposed date will be October 1, 1982 and remain in et t for a period of one year.
