
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

BC RESOLUTION 04-10-13-A 2013 Intertribal Buffalo Council Herd Development Grant

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Tribe is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and

WHEREAS, Oneida Seventh Generation Bison Project promotes food sovereignty and self-sufficiency and is an integral component of the Oneida Community Integrated Food System (OCIFS) because it provides high quality, hormone-free, traditional bison meat products for the improved health and well-being of the Oneida Community, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is committed to maintaining long-term support for the Oneida Seventh Generations Bison Project, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a grant application to the InterTribal Buffalo Council (ITBC) for the FY2013 ITBC Herd Development Grant for the purposes of restoring and supporting the bison population on the Oneida Reservation in a manner that is culturally, ecologically, and economically self-sustaining. The official tribal representative on the ITBC Council shall be Jeff Scofield and his alternative shall be Greg Matson.
