
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

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BC RESOLUTION 04-13-11-E

Amendments to Zoning and Shoreland Protection Law

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Zoning and Shoreland Protection Law (the "Law") governs the development of Tribal land in order to protect the character and stability of residential, commercial, industrial, agricultural, and other areas within the Reservation, and to assure the orderly and beneficial development of such areas; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Law was originally adopted in 1990 and comprehensive amendments have not been made to it since its adoption; and
- WHEREAS, a cross-functional work team made up of individuals from various departments within the Tribe, including Zoning, Engineering, Planning, Environmental and the Law Office, developed the amendments to the Law; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the Law update, clarify and streamline many provisions found in the current law, including: the duties of the Oneida Business Committee, Land Commission and Zoning Administrator; the public hearing process for rezoning property or amending district boundaries; the types of zoning districts found within the Reservation boundaries; the establishment of fees and fines; and the appeal process; and
- WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on November 18, 2010, in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached amendments to the Zoning and Shoreland Protection Law are hereby adopted.
