
RESOLUTION # 4-18-01-C NRCS Environmental Education Outreach Grant

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Environmental Health and Safety Department was created for the purpose of providing services that preserve, restore and enhance our environment, and protect and educate our people consistent with the culture, vision and priorities of the Oneida Nation, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribal Community has begun to restore and naturalize several parcels of land, which include replanting trees, shrubs and native, medicinal Forbess. Educational signage will be placed throughout the naturalized site explaining what people are viewing, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby submit this grant application to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service Environmental Education Outreach grant for the purpose of providing interpretative and educational signs and displays to inform and promote the use of native plants.
