

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Police Department to "provide enhanced law enforcement and security on the Oneida Reservation by protecting our nations residents, employees, and patrons through the enforcement of rules and regulations for the welfare and safety of the community", and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe understands the need to improve and enhance their community policing efforts and resource capabilities, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby submit this application to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Policing Services, Tribal Resources Grant Program for the purpose of providing the Oneida Police Department staff and officer with law enforcement training opportunities and equipment for the enhancement of our community policing efforts.
