

## RESOLUTION #4-20-95-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Early Childhood Program finds that there is a need to clearly set out the policy regarding investigating complaints made by persons who are not employees in the Early Childhood department, and
- WHEREAS, it is found to be necessary to adopt this policy on an emergency basis to allow persons to utilize the procedures set out in the policy as soon as possible, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee finds that this policy grants to interested parties procedures to allow swift resolution of complaints,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee utilizes its emergency powers granted in Article IV of the Administrative Procedures Act to adopt the attached policy on an interim emergency basis for six months beginning from date of adoption, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that this policy shall be come effective on the date of adoption and that the Oneida Early Childhood Program shall be responsible for dispersing the attached policy to all employees within five days of adoption, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED: that at a Public Hearing, scheduled for May 2, 1995, the Oneida Early Childhood Program manager shall submit written testimony regarding procedural issues and usefulness of this policy.
