
## Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

RESOLUTION NO. 2

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, Debra Summers (Moore) and Keith Moore, both tribal members are holder of said lease no. B-1122(78) more particularly described as follows:
- Lot 11, Ridgeland Community Subdivision, a part of Indian Claim No. 34, which lies South of County Hwy. "EE" and southeasterly of County Hwy. "E", Section 29, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, 4th P.M., Outagamie County, Wisconsin, containing 1.50 acres, more or less, subject to all valid existing rights-of-way of record.
- WHEREAS, Debra Summers (Moore) and Keith Moore are holders of said lease site wish to modify their lease as follows: DELETE: Debra Summers (Moore) and Keith Moore, both tribal members INSERT: Debra Summers, a tribal member
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by this Committee in Keeps session assembled, hereby approve the above modification of lease, and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairwoman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease <u>MODIFICATION</u> documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
