

## National Endowment of the Humanities/Preservation Assistance Grant

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of

Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the

Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its Seven Generation Commitment "to revitalize our

Oneida History, Culture, and Heritage by developing and preserving cultural resources and

assessibility to Tribal public and others", and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Cultural Heritage Department/Oneida Nation

Museum to preserve, maintain, and interpret the Oneida traditions, artifacts, language, customs and history in a manner that will promote the dignity and respect of the Oneida people and

culture, and

WHEREAS. the Oneida Nation Museum with the collaboration of the National Endowment of the

Humanities/Preservation Assistance Grants Program would like to preserve, protect and share

the cultural heritage of the Oneida people for the next seven generations, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin in collaboration with the National Endowment of the Humanities/Preservation Assistance Grant Program, authorized and submits this grant application for the purpose of the preservation, storage and layout of the two Museum collection storage rooms and to identify further needs in housing the current and future collections.
