
Fee to Trust Resolution for the Former Sacred Heart Seminary

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has be delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:
Former Sacred Heart Seminary
- WHEREAS,** the parcel is described as follows: See Attached Legal Description
Tax Parcel No. HB-1306, HB-1308
- WHEREAS,** the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing site for Tribal Offices, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

Brown County Parcels

Parcel 1:

All that part of Indian Claim Number One Hundred Forty-five (145) lying within the Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin.

Parcel 2:

That part of Indian Claim Number One Hundred Forty-six (146), in the Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of Indian Claim No. 145 in Section Three (3), Township Twenty-three (23) North, Range Nineteen (19) East, Fourth Principal Meridian, in Wisconsin, thence North 14° West 268 feet; thence North 58° West 201 feet; thence North 65° West 200 feet; thence North 55° West 100 feet; thence S 35° West 122 feet; thence South 55° East 700 feet to the point of beginning and being in the Southeast corner of said Indian Claim No. 146.

Parcel C:

That part of Indian Claim One Hundred Forty-six (146), lying in Brown County, Wisconsin, and lying Southerly of State Trunk Highway "54", in the Village of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, excepting therefrom those parts described in Volume 110 Deeds, Page 373, Volume 145 Deeds, Page 53, and Jacket 7878 Records Image 15, Brown County Records.
