RESOLUTION # 5-05-04-A

Inter-Tribal Bison Cooperative/Tribal Bison Herd Development/Oneida Nation Farms & Agricultural Center/Delegate and Alternative Delegate

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain, and promote self-sufficiency and self reliance by providing food and support services for Oneida Tribal members and others in the community who cannot afford it, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe recognizes and supports the election of the first President, Vice President, and Secretary-Treasurer for the Inter-Tribal Bison Cooperative which occurred in Albuquerque, New Mexico on April 6, 1992, and
- WHEREAS,** in order to directly benefit from the above listed services, and participate as a voting member of the Cooperative, and


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee hereby wishes to retain membership in the Inter-Tribal Bison Cooperative and to participate in the services provided by the organization and its staff.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee hereby appoints the Oneida Nation Farm Manager/Director to represent and vote for the Tribe at the meetings of the Inter-Tribal Bison Cooperative and the alternative delegate designee will be the Oneida Nation Conservation Warden.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin supports the efforts of the Inter-Tribal Bison Cooperative to contract with agencies and organizations for funding to maintain the organization and the services that will be provided directly to Tribal bison programs.
