RESOLUTION NO 5-782-B

WHEREAS, the Graduate School of Social Work, University of Wisconsin, Madison is proposing a program to place graduate social work students in field placements on Wisconsin Indian reservations, and

WHEREAS, the University's proposal would provide an alternative for providing tribal social services at no cost to the tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe's Social Service Program is presently operating on a reduced budget and will be facing additional federal budget cuts, and

WHEREAS, professional social services are needed at Oneida, especially, the development of programs to deal effectively with high-risk clients

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribal Council supports the University's proposal and agrees to a field placement of two graduate students, and that the Health Director and Tribal Administrator develop any necessary agreements with the students and the University, should the University's proposal be approved.
