
## Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

## RESOLUTION # \_5-08-96-B

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has the legislative responsibility to protect the health and welfare of tribal members, and to protect the environment of the Oneida Reservation, and
- WHEREAS. A comprehensive program directed at all present and potential sources of water pollution whether residential, farm, recreational, municipal, industrial or commercial is needed to protect human life and health, fish and aquatic life, scenic and ecological values and domestic, municipal, recreational, industrial, agricultural, cultural, religious, and other uses of Reservation water resources, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe has proposed adoption of a Water Resources Ordinance, and
- WHEREAS, the Water ResourcesOrdinance has received a public hearing in accordance with the Oneida Administrative Procedures Act, and
- WHEREAS all comments received regarding the Water Resources Ordinance have been duly considered by the Oneida Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has made appropriate modifications to the Water ResourcesOrdinance in light of the comments received,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby adopts its Water Resources Ordinance, effective May 8,1996, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Oneida Environmental Department, as the tribal department responsible for the implementation and administration of the programs established by the Water ResourcesOrdinance, develop required water quality standards and other programs and procedures authorized by the Ordinance.
