RESOLUTION NO. 5-10-85-D

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is eligible to apply for contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to plan, conduct, and administer all or parts of Bureau authorized programs, under authority of Public Law 93-638; and,
- WHEREAS, The Tribal Governing Body has determined that it wishes to exercise the contracting option:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The scope of the contract is to plan, conduct and administer the tribal home vegetable garden project.
- 2. The tribal chairman is authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any amendments thereto.
- 3. The authorities granted herein shall be effective until such time as the tribal governing body takes further action by resolution.
- 4. The tribal governing body shall review the contract and any amendments thereto before execution.
- 5. The proposed date for start of the contract is May 1, 1985 and shall be effective through July 31, 1985.
