Whereas, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

Whereas, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

Whereas, the Oneida Business Committee is delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

Whereas, the Oneida Pardon Screening Committee reviewed the pardon petition at a duly called public Pardon Hearing on behalf of Joseph Metoxen, and

Whereas, the requirements of the Oneida Pardon Ordinance and Oneida Pardon Procedures Policy have been fulfilled, and

Now therefore be it resolved that the Oneida Business Committee by this resolution hereby:

☑ Approves the pardon of Joseph Metoxen, Petitioner, and notifies the Oneida Nation and its employing agencies that the Petitioner is recognized as a member of the Oneida Nation to have all the benefits and employment opportunities available to all other persons as if the criminal past pardoned by this resolution did not exist.

☐ Denies the pardon of Joseph Metoxen, petitioner and notifies the petitioner that he may request another pardon after one (1) year from the date of certification of this document.
