- **WHEREAS**, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oncida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its' Seventh Generation Commitment through the Oneida Community Health Center, "To provide the highest level of quality, culturally sensitive, holistic, and preventive healthcare " and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Health Promotions-Disease Prevention Program to focus on weight management and diabetes prevention, to empower the Oneida community to honor their personal roles and responsibilities in making positive lifestyle choices which will improve health, quality of life, and prevent chronic disease, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida family and community will be strengthened by providing critically needed services that will have a positive impact on the health and well-being of our community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin/Oneida Community Health Center (O C H C.)/Health Promotions-Disease Prevention Program in collaboration with the United States Department of Health and Human Services/Centers for Disease Control, authorizes, fully supports and submits this grant application for the purpose of securing external monies to support community use of traditional foods and sustainable ecological approaches for diabetes prevention and health promotion on or near the Oneida Reservation, to engage the community in identifying and sharing stories of healthy traditional ways of being active, and communicating health information and support for diabetes prevention and wellness
