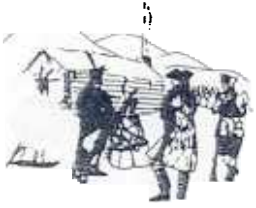

Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States was made possible.


RESOLUTION # 5-15-96-E

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined that one long range goal of the Oneida Nation is to ensure a stable Oneida economy that sustains our sovereign government, family, community and affords all members the opportunities to participate in the economic resources, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Department of Economic Development to establish diversified businesses which will provide alternative income sources to maximize tribal investments and ensure a stable and self-sufficient national economy, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida community has been actively involved in tribal economic development through participation in General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida community has access to project information and progress through the General Tribal Council quarterly and semi-annual reports.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits this application to the Administration for Native Americans for a Social and Economic Development grant.
