## RESOLUTION # 5-17-76-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has an urgent need for suitable home sites,

WHEREAS, a large portion of the Oneida Tribal land base is submarginal,

WHEREAS, these sub-marginal lands have a high water table and will not pass a perculation test,

WHEREAS, a continuing effort has been made to acquire suitable home: sites for Tribal members,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Oneida Tribal Business Committee accept the BIA offer for reclamation of wet lands on trust property,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Oneida Tribe be given the first refusal to contract for this drainage work.
