

RESOLUTION # 5-22-91-D

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is concerned and responsible for the health and welfare of its members and for that of other individuals residing on the Oneida Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is implementing a sewerage system within the sewer service area, and
- WHEREAS, a MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING has been drafted between the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations (DILHR) to require all persons residing within the service area of the Oneida Sanitary District to connect to the sewerage system.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin enters into said Memorandum of Understanding with the Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations (DILHR).

CERTIFICATION
