

RESOLUTION # <u>5-25-89-C</u>

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin recognizes the need to share the Oneida and Iroquoian Cultures with other worldly groups, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has demonstrated its ability to establish and maintain on-going relationships through international cultural exchanges, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is planning an international cultural, educational, and tourist exchange in West Germany for the fall of 1989.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin apply for a grant from the Otto Bremer Foundation of Washburn, Wisconsin.
