Multi-Hazards Mitigation Plan

WHEREAS, Oneida Tribe recognizes the threat that natural hazards pose to people and property; and

WHEREAS, undertaking hazard mitigation actions before disasters occur will reduce the potential for harm to people and property and save taxpayer dollars; and

WHEREAS, an adopted multi-hazards mitigation plan is required as a condition of future grant funding for mitigation projects.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee of the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin, hereby adopts the *Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin Multi-Hazards Mitigation Plan* as an official plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon approval of the *Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin Multi-Hazards Mitigation Plan*, the Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission, on behalf of the Oneida Emergency Management Homeland Security Agency and EMHS Public Safety Officers, will submit the adopted plan to the Federal Emergency Management Agency officials for final review and approval, as required under the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program.
