RESOLUTION #___06-03-98-D_ Cleveland Doxtator and Mae Baxter Residential Lease

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Doxtator, Cleveland, #4982 and Baxter, Mae L., #0629, a/are Tribal Member(s), have made application for a long-term lease for residential purposes; and

WHEREAS, Doxtator, Cleveland, #4982 and Baxter, Mae L., #0629, has/have been designated Lease No. RL-2921(98) for the Tribal land selected and is more particularly described as follows: N5730 County E Road, De Pere WI 54115.

A parcel of land located within S ½ S ½ SW ¼ Section 20, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, 4th Principal Meridian, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, (Claim 39), more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the S ¼ corner of said Section 20; thence S 89°18'10"W., a distance of 894.45 feet; thence N59°35'44"W., a distance of 350 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence continuing N 59°35'44"W. A distance of 208 feet, more or less, to the East right-of-way line of County Hwy, E; thence N 30°10'E., following said right-of-way line, a distance of 208 feet; thence S 59°35'44" E., a distance of 208 feet; thence S 30°10'W., a distance of 208 feet, more or less, to the Point of Beginning, containing 1.00 acres, more or less, subject to all valid existing rights-of-way of record.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin's Division of Land Management is responsible for managing all tribal real property assets, including leases, through rules and policies approved in Oneida Real Property Law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Committee in Regular assembled, hereby requests the Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, to draft a lease in accordance with the Act of August 9, 1955 (69 Stat, 539), as amended, 25 USC 415, for the above-described land with a 25 year term which shall automatically and without notice renew for an additional term of 25 years at a total rental, \$1.00 per year or \$50 for fifty years, at a total rental to be determined by an appraisal, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Christine M. Doxtator, Land Management Director, or her designee, be authorized to execute said lease agreement on behalf of the Oneida Tribe.
