


Oncidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

Bocause of the help of this Oneida Chief in comenting a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States was made possible.

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of the Oneida Reservation was organized in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (40 stat. 984).
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribal Council members met in regular session of the 7th day of June, 1976.
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Incorporated currently has an Indian Action Team program.
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Indian Action Team program has been successfully operating since July, 1975.
- WHEREAS, it is a consensus of the Oneida Business Committee that the Indian Action Team program is beneficial both to the Tribe and to the community.
- WHEREAS, it is felt both desirable and necessary that the Indian Action Team operation continue for fiscal year 1977.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests continuation of the Indian Action Team program for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Incorporated.
