


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc.

Oneida Resolution Committee Ordinance

- 1. This ordinance shall be known as the Oneida Resolution Committee Ordinance.
- 2. Purpose of this ordinance is for a Resolution Committee to be appointed by the Tribal Chairman to review and amend all resolutions introduced at a special or semi-annual meeting of the General Tribal Council.
- 3. All resolutions to be introduced at a special or semi-annual meeting of the General Tribal Council shall be submitted to Oneida Tribal Chairman seven days prior to said meeting for inclusion on the meeting agenda.
- 4. The Tribal Chairman shall submit the resolution or resolutions to the Resolution Committee for review and amendment.
- 5. Any resolution not submitted to Tribal Chairman seven days prior to said meeting may be introduced, but will require an unanimous decision to become a mandate.
- 6. Any resolution may be withdrawn from the Resolution Committee at anytime before amendment or decision by the party who submitted the resolution.
