

BC Resolution # <u>06-10-98-A</u>

Adoption of Ordinance for the Protection and Management of Archeological, Cultural, and Historic Resources

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of the Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority of the Constitution of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, this resolution presents for adoption a preservation ordinance for the Oneida Tribe drafted by the Cultural Heritage Department, and

WHEREAS, the proposed preservation ordinance has been presented for Public Hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act and the comments have been reviewed and addressed,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached ordinance is hereby adopted by the Oneida Business Committee for implementation on May 1, 1998, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Cultural Heritage Department shall utilize the month of April to inform the general public of the adoption of this law and its purpose through notices in the Kalihwisaks as well as identify the integration of this law into the building process of the Oneida Tribe.
