RESOLUTION # 613-90-B

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians are faced with several varied threats to the surface and groundwater resources of the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs provides funding to Indian Tribes for the purpose of identifying those threats.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin will need fiscal year 1990 Water Quality Management Planning funds to continue ongoing co-operative ground water investigations for the Oneida Trib.
