

RESOLUTION NO. 75-6-26

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. have initiated an industrial development plan for a long range period, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc. have presently budgeted under the Native American Program an Industrial Developer for an eight month period and that this individuals program funding period will expire on or about August 31, 1975, and
- WHEREAS, Public Law 93-638 permits Indian Tribes to Administrate existing Bureau of Indians Affairs Programs as the local level and that said programs are to be financed under existing Bureau of Indian Affairs fiscal obligations on a per capita and or Tribal share, and
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee is requesting that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Minneapolis Area Office determine how and Industrial Developer may be funded under the existing fiscal budget.
