RESOLUTION # 6-22-94-E

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Albert Manders, Jr., a Tribal Member, 1997 Seminary Road, DePere, WI, has submitted application to lease a parcel of Oneida Tribal land for agricultural purposes; and

WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows: Two parcels of land located within the S 1/2 S 1/2 SE 1/4, Section 30, Township 23 North, Range 19 East, 4th Principal Meridian, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, more particularly described as follows: Parcel 1: Commencing at the Southeast corner of Said Section 30; thence West along the south section line, a distance of 1755.29 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence continuing West, a distance of 638 feet, more or less, to the centerline of CTH "E"; thence N.35°E, a distance of 308.60 feet; thence East, a distance of 230 feet; thence N.35°E, a distance of 292 feet; thence S.03°31'43"W, a distance of 492 feet, more or less, to the Point of Beginning. Parcel 2: Commencing at the Southeast corner of said Section 30; thence West along the south section line, a distance of 330 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence continuing West, a distance of 1248.29 feet; thence N.03°31'43"E., a distance of 459.77 feet; thence N.89°37'35"E, a distance of 1249 feet; thence South, a distance of 460 feet, more or less, to the Point of Beginning. The above parcels are subject to all valid existing rights-of-way of record. Aggregate total of property: 13 acres, more or less.

WHEREAS, the applicant has requested that the Lease term be for a period of five (5) years at a rental rate of \$143.00 annually, paid to the Treasurer, of the Oneida Business Committee.


