Whereas, in Section 1102 (b) of P.L. 95-561 the Secretary of the Interior is instructed to conduct a ballot among the tribes and Alaskan villages and to publish by July 1, 1979 that formula which the majority of the tribes determine through their vote to be most equitable.

Nowtherefore be it resolved that on the 27th of June , 1979 the Oneida Tribe of Indians (tribe or Alaskan village) governing body chose Formula Option THREE by a vote of for an against and furthermore urge CONGRESS to allocate funds sufficient for 100% distribution I hereby certify that the above written resolution was duly passed by the governing body as an official act.
