- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain, and promote self-sufficiency and self reliance by providing food for those who cannot afford it, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Food Distribution Program would like to establish a community-based food distribution service network, and
- WHEREAS, that Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family will be strengthened by promoting the overall health and wellness of all Oneida Community members, especially for those who cannot afford food.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin-Oneida Food Distribution Program authorizes and submits this grant application to the State of Wisconsin/University of Wisconsin Cooperative Extension-Community based Hunger Prevention Project for the purpose of securing a Nutrition Education Component and Food Pantry Service Network for the Oneida Food Distribution Program and for the Oneida Community Members.
