## RESOLUTION # 07-01-98-8 Standing Stone Drive Resolution

the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian WHEREAS, government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, and

the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article WHEREAS, IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribe Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and

the Bureau of Indian Affairs under contract number F55-928 requires VHEREAS, granting of a right-of-way in order to authorize road improvements on the following parcel of the Oneida Nation Tribal land: NE 1/4, Section 3, T 23N, R 19E, known locally as Standing Stone Drive.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVE: that a grant of right-of-way for BIA road improvements on the above parcel of land is hereby approved. Due to the overall benefits to the Tribe and its members derived from the road improvements, compensation for granting the right-of-way is hereby waved. The Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, is requested to prepare and recommend approval of the right-of-way documents.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin authorizes its chairperson, Deborah J. Doxtator and Secretary, Julie Barton to enter into negotiations with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the above stated purpose.
