RESOLUTION # <u>07-07-99A</u> Second Glory Road Project Resolution

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and
- WHEREAS, Congress by enactment of the Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century provided a mechanism for Indian Tribes to exercise the right to SELF-DETERMINATION, and
- WHEREAS, the Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century has provided funding for Indian Reservation Road construction that can be used for any public road, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation has a vital concern for the safety and transportation of its tribal membership and is authorized to act in <u>il</u> matters that concern the welfare of the tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Glory Road construction project would serve both the Oneida Nation and the Village of Ashwaubenon.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Nation requests Indian Reservation Road funds under PL93-638 for the construction of Glory Road.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Oneida Nation requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to enter into a cooperative agreement for the construction of Glory Road and, further authorizes the Oneida Nation Tribal Chairperson to enter into negotiations with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for the above stated purpose.
