Sustainable Employment and Economic Growth Development Strategies (SEEDS) Grant DHHS/ACF – Administration for Native Americans

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS,** the current unemployment rate on the Oneida reservation is 22%, which is three (3) times that of the general Brown and Outagamie county area, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin supports efforts to increase the economic self-sufficiency of tribal members, and
- WHEREAS,** the mission of the Oneida Workforce Development program is to strengthen and provide tools to become self-sufficient and to increase employability skills for Oneida community members,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a grant application to the Department of Health and Human Services/Administration for Children and Families – Administration for Native Americans, Sustainable Employment and Economic Development Strategies (SEEDS) 2013 grant opportunity to support job growth, reduce unemployment, and promote self-sufficiency for Oneida community members.
