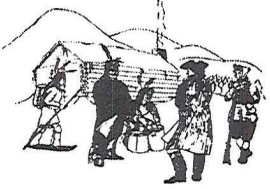


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

BC Resolution 07-13-11-A

Supporting the Brown County Kids Count 54218 Program and Kids Count Task Force Initiatives for Healthy Kids

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally-recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee recognizes the importance of focusing on the health, happiness and strength of the Oneida people for generations to come, and especially to improve the health and well-being of our children; and
- WHEREAS,** the rate of childhood obesity has tripled in the past 30 years, making it critical to teach our children healthy habits and promote healthy lifestyle decisions; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has supported First Lady Michelle Obama's "Raising Healthy Families" and "Let's Move" campaigns aimed at eliminating childhood obesity; and
- WHEREAS,** the Green Bay Area Chamber of Commerce and Brown County businesses and organizations have established a Kids Count Task Force to promote the 54218 Program that encourages five servings of fruits and vegetables, four bottles of water, less than two hours of screen time, more than one hour of physical activity, and eight hours of sleep on a daily basis; and
- WHEREAS,** the Kids Count Task Force has identified four initiatives to raise healthy kids: 1) Create Healthy Schools, 2) Help Parents Make Healthy Family Choices, 3) Provide Access to Healthy and Affordable Food, and 4) Promote Physical Activity; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee and the Oneida Community Health Center are committed to implementing recreational and educational activities that promote active and healthy lifestyles for Oneida children.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin supports the Kids Count 54218 Program and Kids Count Task Force Initiatives and hereby designates the Oneida Community Health Center's Health Promotion and Disease Prevention office to participate on the Kids Count Task Force.
