BC Resolution # <u>07-15-98-C</u> Resolution Adopting Oneida Audit Law

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of the Wisconsin, and

- WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority of the Constitution of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Audit Law has been reviewed by the Legislative Operating Committee and presented at Public Hearing on June 4, 1998, and
- WHEREAS, the Audit Law was developed to identify basic processes of investigation as well as delegations of authority, and
- WHEREAS, the Legislative Operating Committee has reviewed the Audit Law in its final form and recommends adoption of the law,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Audit Law, attached, is hereby adopted by the Oneida Business Committee for implementation 30 days after the date of adoption, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Audit Committee is responsible for integrating current or ongoing audits into the processes set forth in the Audit Law, for monitoring the Audit Law for necessary changes, and identification of persons or offices which require notice of the adoption of this law. <u>CERTIFICATION</u>
