

RESOLUTION # 7-17-96-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV., Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 1988, Conrad King was convicted of the violation of embezzlement (Title 18 U.S.C., s 1163) from the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, defendant Conrad King was placed on probation for a period of five (5) years, and

WHEREAS, defendant Conrad King was ordered to pay twenty two thousand dollars (\$22,000) for Tribal Administration and legal expenses, eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) in restitution for a total of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000), and one thousand five hundred (1,500) hours of community service for the benefit of the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, on June 29, 1993, the United States District Court ordered that the balance of community service of two hundred four (204) hours be remitted and the probation term be allowed to expire with restitution owing and that the restitution be reduced to fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) as recommended by the victim, with credit for payments already submitted.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That Conrad King having satisfied all requirements of his charge and conviction be considered for pardon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the pardon pertain to all employment and benefits with the exception of Gaming related employment and benefits.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED: that Conrad King be pardoned with the aforementioned conditions and restrictions.
